Job summary

Data collectors will participate in the evaluation of two research projects: Health Promotion Through Environmental Design (HPTED) and Preventing Illegal Dumping to Address Community Violence. As a data collector, you will work as part of team conducting door-to-door surveys and property assessments. The survey asks questions about how changes to the built environment affect community health and wellbeing. Parcel assessments are intended to measure levels of blight and the physical condition of buildings and lawns. Both studies are projects at the University of Michigan School of Public Health. This is a great position for members of the Flint community, including students who would like to gain research experience.

These positions are in-person and based in Flint, Michigan.

Job responsibilities

- · Recruiting residents to complete a short survey
- · Conducting property assessments
- · Preparing data collection materials
- · Entering and managing data
- · Delivering informational materials about the study to households
- · Other duties as required

Pay rate

This position pays \$15- \$20 per hour dependent on experience

Work Schedule:

8-hour shifts will be scheduled between 7am and 8pm, depending on the needs of the project. Most work days will be Monday through Friday. Some work shifts will occur on Saturdays and Sundays. Most work hours will occur outdoors and shifts may be canceled in the event of poor weather (rain, extreme heat or cold).

Qualifications:

- High School education or equivalent (e.g., GRE completion).
- Good communication skills, reliability, and ability to work independently.
- Strong organizational skills
- Ability to work well in pairs/teams.
- Must be comfortable working in community settings with minimal supervision.
- Must have a reliable vehicle for entire shift. You will work with a partner.
- Candidates working outdoors must be able to traverse streets, including sidewalks, broken sidewalks, and steps to residential entrances up to eight miles per day.
